# Site selection

Find a safe location, free of decay above and debris below.




Ground hazards




# Use good anchors

Large, living trees, at least a hand span width, and 12–15 feet apart.




### Pitch perfect

Set anchor points about head high, with the head end about 6 inches lower. Set hammock at sit height from ground. Use a 30° angle on the suspension.




#### **HOW TO LAY**

Lay diagonally across the hammock for best results



# **USING PACK HOOKS**

Clip the under quilt suspension to the pack hook to keep it in place.



# ABOUT THAT RIDGELINE



Every good info card needs a warning, right? Well, here's ours:

#### **▲** Use the ridgeline!

We're not kidding—your netted hammock will tear if you use the hammock without the ridgeline. Just sayin'.
