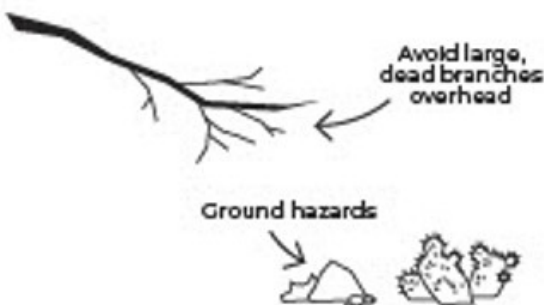


# HOW TO HANG

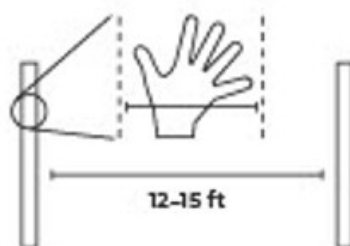
## 1 Site selection

Find a safe location, free of decay above and debris below.



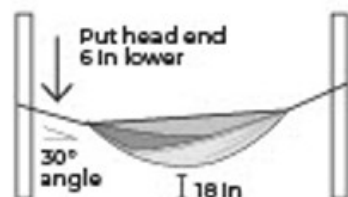
## 2 Use good anchors

Large, living trees, at least a hand span width, and 12-15 feet apart.



## 3 Pitch perfect

Set anchor points about head high, with the head end about 6 inches lower. Set hammock at sit height from ground. Use a 30° angle on the suspension.



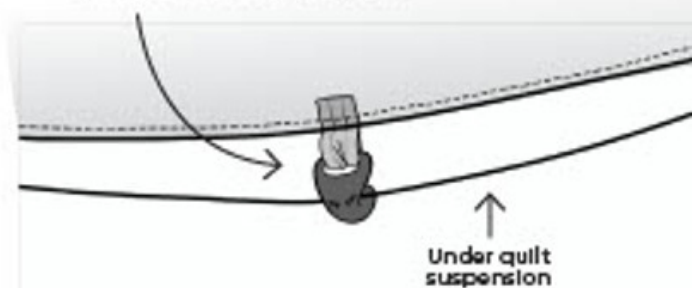
## HOW TO LAY

Lay diagonally across the hammock for best results

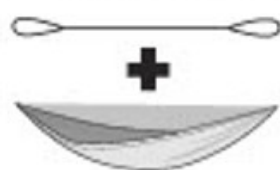


## USING PACK HOOKS

Clip the under quilt suspension to the pack hook to keep it in place.



## ABOUT THAT RIDGELINE



Every good info card needs a warning, right? Well, here's ours:

### ▲ Use the ridgeline!

We're not kidding—your netted hammock will tear if you use the hammock without the ridgeline. Just say'n'.

Oh, and *don't sit on the bug netting*. It's designed to repel bugs, not butts. It'll rip, you'll be sad, and that's not covered in our warranty (user-caused tears, not tears; we'll cry with you).
